TEMPORARY ORDER IN RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY

JOURNAL ENTRY ACCESS TO COURTROOM

This Order supplements the Court's Orders filed on March 18, 2020 and March 24, 2020. As a result of the anticipated re-opening of the Municipal Court for in-person appearances, and in compliance with the modified State of Emergency, Stay-at-home requirements and CDC guidelines, the Court hereby Orders the following:

- 1. Beginning Monday, April 27, 2020, ALL people <u>required</u> to personally appear for Municipal Court [defendants (criminal and traffic), subpoenaed witnesses (for trials and hearings), plaintiffs (for evictions, small claims and civil cases)] attorneys, prosecutors and law enforcement will be required to wear a face mask. The face mask is required to cover your nose and mouth and must be worn into the courthouse and worn the entire time while in the courthouse.
- 2. **NO** visitors, guests or children will be permitted in the courthouse as it relates to all Municipal Court cases.
- 3. Payments and filings will continue to be accepted (and HIGHLY recommended) by remote and electronic means which include:

- 4. Beginning, May 4, 2020, in-person payments and filings will be accepted only on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:00am to 11:30am and from 1:00pm to 4:00pm. Only one (1) person will be permitted in the building to pay and/or file and will be required to wear a face mask. The face mask is required to cover your nose and mouth and must be worn into the courthouse and worn the entire time while in the courthouse.
- 5. Everyone appearing in-person to Municipal Court will be required to keep a six (6) foot distance from all other people in the courthouse at all times (social distancing).

This Temporary Order shall remain in effect until further order of the Court.
